Status of Applying for Medicaid Online

- The "portal": https://www.yourtexasbenefits.com
- Create an account for each individual in your firm who will file Medicaid applications (by pretending to apply for a benefit)
- Don't enter application information now—it won't all get to the worker. Fill out Form H1200 (initial application) or H1200-A (annual review) and upload as a document

Benefits of Filing Online

Once you apply online you can:

- Check the status of your benefits
- Report changes to your case
- Renew your benefits
- Print a Medicaid card
- Upload items HHSC needs from you



Medicaid Rental Income Policy Revised

- Eligibility may be certified on an annual basis if in best interests of the client (divide property tax, insurance, etc. by 12)
- However, 6-month averaging must be used for copayment in all cases
- Problem: copayment may change several times per year
- Solution: As always—have tenant pay all expenses as incurred, directly to tax district, insurance co., etc.
