 - Easement v. Fee Conveyance
- What do all of these cases have in common?
- The party with the "stronger" argument argues that equitable defenses do not matter in unambiguous deed disputes—or at a minimum—only apply to estop past damages.

Sun Oil Co. (Del.) v. Madeley, 626 S.W.2d 726 (Tex. 1981)



- 1932 Oil and Gas Lease provided:
 - Lessee shall deliver to Lessors... one-half of the oil accruing to the seven-eighths working interest from that produced and saved from said land, same to be delivered [**7] in the same manner as provided for the delivery of said royalty oil; subject, however, to the deductions and charges hereinafter provided.
- For forty years, Sun Oil delivered one of the working interest proceeds on oil and gas.
- Sun Oil then revoked the division orders and argued the lease did not require a payment on one-half the working interest proceeds for gas.
- Both parties agreed lease was unambiguous.
- Lessors argued estoppel, waiver, and ratification.
