#### **House Bill 3**

- By Representative Burrows.
- Passed in regular 88<sup>th</sup> legislative session and became effective on September 1, 2023.
- The goal is to improve the physical security and safety of public schools and charter schools.

# **Armed Security Guard**

- At least one armed security officer at every campus during school hours.
- If schools cannot hire a separate officer, then someone else already on campus must act as a security officer.
- If not commissioned peace officer, then cannot perform law enforcement duties, like making arrests. But there is an exception allowing them to if there is an emergency that poses a threat of death or serious bodily injury to a person.
