In Federal Court at Least Seven (7) Applicable Rules of Evidence

- i. Rule 104: Preliminary questions
- ii. Rule 702: Testimony by experts
- iii. Rule 703: Bases of opinion testimony by experts
- iv. Rule 704: Opinion on ultimate issue
- v. Rule 705: Disclosure of facts or data underlying expert opinion
- vi. Rule 401: Definition of relevant evidence
- vii. Rule 403: Exclusion of relevant evidence on grounds of prejudice, confusion or waste of time
 - •Same rules apply in Texas state courts

Four Requirements for Admission of Expert Witness Testimony

- 1) Qualified expert
- 2) Reliability of opinions
- 3) Relevance of testimony
- 4) Probative value outweighs prejudice

See Watkins v. Telsmith, Inc., 121 F.3d 984 (5th Cir. 1997).

Standard for Qualification of Experts – Little Changed in 40 Years

1) Specialized knowledge, skill, experience, training or education

AND

2) Which will assist judge or jury to understand the evidence or determine a fact in issue.

See Fed. R. Evid. 702; Tex. R. Evid. 702.

- i. Daubert v. Merrell Dow Pharmaceuticals
- ii. General Electric Co. v. Joiner
- iii. Kumho Tire Co. v. Carmichael

Daubert Standard

- Pronounced "Dow-burt," 43 Emory L.J. 867 (1994).
- 1993 case in which plaintiff alleged a drug caused birth defects.
- Prevalent standard for admissibility of expert testimony was "general acceptance" in the field, under the Frye test from Frye v. United States, 293 F. 1013 (D.C. Cir. 1923)
- Plaintiff's expert's opinion was based on studies which had not gained "general acceptance."
- Supreme Court rejected Frye's "general acceptance" test, expanding admissible testimony to include any that is based on a reliable methodology. Daubert v. Merrell Dow Pharm., Inc., 509 U.S. 579 (1993).
