Paid Sick Leave

What do paid sick leave laws prescribe?

- Definition of covered employers and employees
- Amount of leave (accrual rates and accrual/use caps)
- Timing (for earning and using leave)
- Reasons for leave (often extends beyond illness or injury)





Paid Sick Leave (cont.)

What do paid sick leave laws prescribe? (cont.)

- Carryover amounts
- Rate of pay for leave hours taken
- Confirmation of reason for use of leave
- Payout at termination
- Notices and recordkeeping
