- 1. Home-Rule: Full power of self government
 - Finds authority & limitations in Home-Rule Charter & statutes


Tx Const art 11 § 5,

- 2. General-Law: Finds authority & limitations in statutes
 - **Type A:** 600+ inhabitants, 6 Member Board of Aldermen
 - Type B: 201-9,999 inhabitants, 6 Member Board of Alderman
 - Type C: 201-4,999 inhabitants, 3 Member Commission

3. Special-Law: Finds authority in Legislative Charter & statues

Boundaries: City Limits & ETJ




City Limits

City Limits = Incorporated Municipal Boundary

LGC §41

- Determined at Incorporation
- Expands by Annexation
- Surveyed Map is Required
- Full Municipal Police Powers
- Zoning
- Building Codes
- Nuisance Prevention & Abatement
- Protect Public Health, Safety, & Welfare
