PRE-1956

- Prior to 1956, E&P companies developed individual custom forms to manage joint projects
 - Inefficient
 - Expensive
 - Inconsistent

KRAFTBILT 610 AGREEMENT

- Early 1950's In hopes of bringing uniformity and predictability to the industry, a group of landmen from Tulsa and OKC called a meeting of industry reps to discuss development of a model form OA
- Committee of seven works on the form for 4 years, beginning with exemplars of various company's custom OA
- Form presented to and endorsed by AAPL at 1956 annual meeting in Denver
- Originally named Kraftbilt 610 Agreement, later renamed AAPL Form 610

AAPL FORM 610

- Designate Rights and Responsibilities Among Operator and Non-Ops
- Mechanism for Resolving Operational Disagreements Among JOA Parties
- Allocate Costs and Benefits According to Respective Parties' Interests

1956 Model Form OA Exculpatory Clause

• _____ shall be the <u>Operator of the Unit Area</u>, and shall conduct and direct and have full control of all <u>operations on the Unit Area</u> as permitted and required by, and within the limits of, this agreement. It shall conduct <u>all such operations</u> in a good and workmanlike manner, but it shall have <u>no liability as Operator</u> to the other parties for losses sustained, or liabilities incurred, <u>except such as may result from gross negligence or from breach of the provisions of this agreement.</u>
