

# SERVICE & EMOTIONAL SUPPORT ANIMALS IN THE WORKPLACE

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# Disabled people and the animals that assist them are entitled to have access to:

- The workplace
- All places open to the public
- Public transportation
- Housing
- Schools and universities



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## Workplace statutes:

- ADA Title I: applies to private employers (42 U.S.C § 12112)
- ADA Title II: applies to state and local governments (42 USC §12131)
- Rehabilitation Act of 1973: applies to federal government, its contractors, and entities that receive federal funds (29 U.S.C. §701 et seq)
- ▼<u>Texas Labor Code</u>: applies to all employers in Texas (Texas Labor Code §21.128)

### Employee or job applicant must be disabled





"Disability" means "a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more major life activities..., a record of such an impairment, or being regarded as having such an impairment."

"Major life activities" include, but are not limited to, caring for oneself, concentrating, performing manual tasks, seeing, hearing, eating, sleeping, thinking, walking, standing, lifting, bending, speaking, breathing, learning, reading, communicating, and working. Major life activities also include "the operation of a major bodily function..."

#### **Two Categories of Animals:**

#### **Service Animal**



Animal that is trained to perform a specific task for a person with a physical or mental disability. Training may be done by owner.

### **Emotional Support Animal**



Animal's presence provides emotional support, comfort or companionship but is not trained to perform a task related to a disability.





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
