"[T]here is no blanket immunity that exempts lawyers from being deposed. ..."

"Simple possession of a law license does not result in blanket immunity from a deposition."

THE GENERAL RULE

"There is no rule that gives an attorney or an attorney's employees a privilege from being called to testify. ..."

"Except as otherwise provided by Constitution, by statute, by these rules, or by other rules prescribed pursuant to statutory authority, no person has a privilege to ... refuse to be a witness."
