Rule 6.1 Voluntary Pro Bono Publico Service

- (1) persons of limited means or
- (2) charitable, religious, civic, community, governmental and educational organizations in matters that are designed primarily to address the needs of persons of limited means



emphasis on provision of direct legal services

- the Model Rules recognize that lawyers have a special responsibility to secure access to justice for the poor —
- with a corresponding duty to ensure that justice is not rationed by the inability to pay
