**IF
Beneficiary
is a PODB...**

AND Participant Died BEFORE the Required Beginning Date...

- PODB can defer all withdrawals until 10th year after participant died
- Entire balance of IRA must be withdrawn in 10 years

AND Participant Died AFTER the Required Beginning Date...

- PODB must take annual withdrawals (based on somebody's life expectancy) during the 10 years
- Entire balance of IRA must be withdrawn in 10 years
