Increased Litigation Potential



- Spouses: First, Second, etc.;
- Children;
- Intention to preference some beneficiaries over others;
- Non-traditional relationships;
- Closely held entities;
- Family recreational assets;
- Involvement of family members in financial matters;
- Beneficiaries with drug, alcohol or other dependencies;
- Too much power in some/too little in others.



Initial Drafting Considerations



- Clear objectives: lifetime and at death;
- Planning to provide for possible conflicts of preferred fiduciaries;
- Planning for possible self-dealing desires and restrictions;
- Balancing or preventing some client's, fiduciary's and beneficiary's involvement in assets;
- Inserting incentives for beneficiaries and fiduciaries to comply with terms;
- Inserting disincentives for interlopers: lifetime and at death;
- Standards and protections for fiduciaries of all types.

- Trustees:
 - Trust Instrument;
 - Texas Trust Code; and
 - Existing Common Law.
- Executors:
 - Will and Codicils;
 - Texas Estates (& Some of Trust) Code; and
 - Existing Common Law.
- Agents:
 - Power of Attorney;
 - Texas Estates Code; and
 - Existing Common Law.
