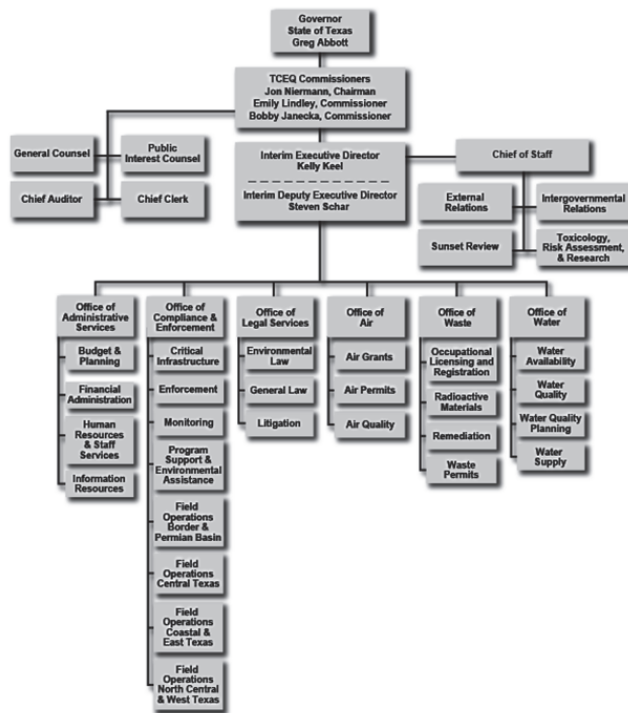

SB 1397 – TCEQ SUNSET

- Senator Schwertner (Georgetown) & Representative Bell (Forney)
- Began Summer 2021 with Self Evaluation Report (SER)
- Passed 6/18/2023 and Effective 9/1/2023
- Main takeaway: Extends Agency until 9/1/2035

SB 1397 – TCEQ SUNSET

- Focus:
 - Outreach, notice, education, and public access
 - Revisions to compliance and enforcement processes, including penalties
 - Permitting: codification, notification, and BMPs
 - E-Flows

BUDGET AND EXCEPTION ITEM REQUESTS

- HB 1 – Appropriations Bill
- 7 Exception Item Requests:
 - Targeted Salary Increases
 - Agency Website Usability
 - Increase Access to Public Records
 - Maintenance/Security
 - Compliance History Updates
 - Hazardous Dams
 - Changes to Exempt Positions
- SB 30 – Supplemental Appropriation
 - EtO Analyzer – Vehicles - 5% pay increase
