Rule 1016. Death or Incompetency of Debtor



Death or incompetency of the debtor shall not abate a liquidation case under chapter 7 of the Code. In such event the estate shall be administered, and the case concluded in the same manner, so far as possible, as though the death or incompetency had not occurred. [11 U.S.C. 1016].

If an individual's debt adjustment case is pending under chapter 13, the case may be dismissed; or if further administration is possible and in the best interest of the parties, the case may proceed and be concluded in the same manner, so far as possible, as though the death or incompetency had not occurred.

DEATH - Chapter 7



Death before 341 Meeting

Court may need to excuse appearance. Caselaw points to PR of decedent's estate appearing (see In re Lucio, 251 B.R. 705 W.D. Tex. 2000).



Death before Financial Management Course

May need court to excuse deceased debtor from completion.



Death before Discharge

Courts are not consistent.

Possible where debtor appeared at 341 and filed financial management course certificate prior to death.
