The Current Realities

- In 2019, over 54M Americans over 65
 - approximately 16.5% of U.S. Population
- By 2034, estimated to be 77M Americans over 65
 - first time in U.S. history that older people (65 or older) outnumber children (under 18).
- In 2020, estimated 5.8M Americans over 65 living with Alzheimer's
 - approximately 1.8% of the U.S. population.
 - By 2050, number expected to nearly triple to approximately 14M.
- Up to 5M older Americans abused every year, with financial loss estimated to be atleast \$36.5 billion

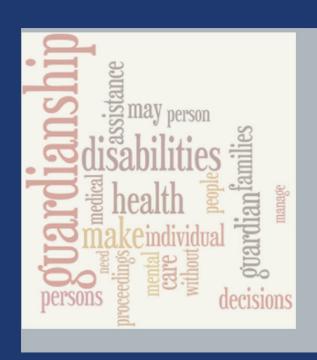

What is a guardianship?

 A Court-supervised procedure where <u>one person</u> is granted legal authority to make personal or financial decisions for someone who can no longer make such decisions for himself or herself.

What is a guardianship proceeding?

- Any matter relating to:
 - 1. The appointment of a guardian of a minor or other incapacitated person;
 - 2. A guardianship or a substitute for a guardianship;
 - 3. A mental health action; and
 - 4. A management trust under Ch. 1301.
