TEXAS Department of Family and Protective Services Important Reporting Concepts

- Texas law says anyone who has reasonable cause to believe a child, elderly person or adult with a disability is being abused, neglected, or exploited must report.
- A professional may not delegate to or rely on another person to make the report.
